
Committees


- Community Building and Engagement assists in continued development and sustainability of community building programs and serves as a feedback loop from the public to the organization.

MISSION

NeighborWorks Lincoln improves lives by expanding affordable housing opportunities and strengthening neighborhoods.

Homeownership

NeighborWorks Lincoln's homeownership program is here to take away some of the mystery behind home purchasing, and, for eligible buyers, provide down payment assistance and rehabilitation funds to help Lincoln residents purchase their first home! The homeownership program has three key components:

1. Homebuyer Education

NWL provides a HUD-approved pre-purchase course designed to prepare you for home ownership. Homebuyer education is available for all Lincoln residents, regardless of income.

2. Down Payment Assistance

NWL provides down payment assistance to help with the required down payment and closing costs that go along with purchasing a home.

Assistance varies per family and is based on household income and the sale price of the home.

3. Rehabilitation Assistance

Financial assistance also covers a limited rehabilitation scope typically focused on repairs or upgrades that help avoid unexpected maintenance for the first three to five years of ownership.



Community Building

NeighborWorks Lincoln strengthens neighborhoods across the city by partnering with residents and stakeholders to cultivate relationships. The community building and engagement program works to improve quality of life for all Lincoln residents through Asset-Based Community Development (ABCD). The three key principles of ABCD are:

- 1. Relationship Based
- 2. Strength Based
- 3. Resident Led

Resident-led community development strengthens neighborhoods by working with the existing strengths of a neighborhood to lead sustainable and mutually beneficial community change. NWL recognizes the power of resident leadership and supports:

- ▶ Neighborhood/community visioning and planning
- Place-based initiatives
- ► Resident engagement opportunities
